**RE:           CONDITIONAL USE FOR EMMY'S CAFÉ AT 67 S. BROADWAY**

Kristin Kotara of Emmy's Café has purchased the building at 67 S. Broadway that was formerly home to the Taste of Mexico & the Grill. Emmy's Café is a new concept that focuses upon bringing gaming into an upscale environment and away from a bar setting; however, the licensing concerning gaming machines follows the ability to pour liquor under the code of the local municipality. The owners are attempting to complete a buildout and restoration of the building in a manner that fully complies with the Core Area Design Guidelines.

In order to pour alcohol, which is required to allow gaming machines to be provided, Emmy's requires a conditional use. The petitioner has applied for the conditional use found in Table 7, Group R of the village code – a bar without live entertainment or dancing. In addition to the conditional use to be considered via a conditional use request, the owner of the business must also be provided an available liquor license and must meet all of the corresponding liquor application requirements.

The ZBA conducted a public hearing concerning the matter on March 7<sup>th</sup>. The Board supported the petition and recommended it for adoption to the Board of Trustees via a 6-1 vote. The owner of the adjacent property to the north, Sandy Vyes appeared and spoke with concerns that were mitigated within the ordinance prepared for review during the regular meeting. These concerns included the north exterior door to the property that provided ingress/egress onto the adjacent property and the need to add a door to the east side of the building to be assured deliveries and employees could park on the east side of the building and would not be forced to utilize the existing drive along the north side of the building (which is owned by the adjacent neighbor).

Attached are the documents that had been submitted for the board's review. Conditions included within the ordinance slightly modify these drawings to meet the recommendation of the ZBA for adoption. In addition the aforementioned changes, the exterior on the south side of the building shall have matching brick instead of replacement of the wood siding.

**Recommendation:**



**AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A CONDITIONAL USE TO OPERATE A BAR WITHOUT LIVE ENTERTAINMENT OR DANCING AT 67 S. BROADWAY IN THE VILLAGE OF COAL CITY**

**WHEREAS**, an application for a conditional use according to Section 156.93 of the Village of Coal City Zoning Code (“Zoning Code”) was filed by Emmy’s Café represented by Kristin Kotara (“applicant”) on February 11, 2016 for the operation of a bar without live entertainment of dancing within a C-4 zoned property; and

**WHEREAS**, a public hearing regarding the conditional use consideration was held on March 7, 2016; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Coal City Planning and Zoning Board met on March 7, 2016 to consider passage of the conditional use request to the Board of Trustees; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 156.230 permits the Village Board to approve certain uses on a conditional basis from the Zoning Code; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Board of Trustees and the President of the Village of Coal City believe it is in the best interests of the Village to grant conditional uses.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Coal City, Grundy and Will Counties, Illinois, as follows:

**Section 1.** Recitals. The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated into and made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth in this Section 1.

**Section 2.** Findings of Fact. The Board of Trustees find as follows:

- A. **Traffic**. Expected traffic flow from the Emmy’s Café is consistent with other types of uses within the C-4 zoned Core Area of the Village and will not have an adverse effect on surrounding properties.
- B. **Environmental Nuisance**. There shall not be any environmental nuisances that emanate from the conditional use. The utilization of the property for the proposed use shall not cause glare, noise, or odor that affects the neighboring properties.
- C. **Neighborhood Character**. The utilization of the property as a bar without live entertainment or dancing will not result in undue deleterious effect upon the neighborhood. The use of the property in this manner was configured to accommodate the property and shall be harmonious to its adjacent neighbors.
- D. **Public Services and Facilities**. The property shall not require any additional installation or greater utilization of public services to serve the proposed conditional use.

- E. **Public Safety and Health.** Granting this conditional use shall allow the new property owner to restore the building to comply with the Core Area Design Guidelines, which shall improve the public health and safety of the community bringing the property up to current building codes and improving the existing structure.
- F. **Other Factors.** The property shall provide many of the same retail services for which the property had been utilized in the past to include the provision of alcohol to its clients and access to legal gaming.

**Section 4.** Description of the Property. The property is located at 67 South Broadway in the Village of Coal City within a C-4 District.

**Section 5.** Public Hearings. A public hearing concerning the consideration of a conditional use was advertised on February 17, 2016 in the Coal City Courant and held by the Planning and Zoning Board on March 7, 2016 at which time a majority of the Planning and Zoning Board members recommended passage of the Conditional Use to the Board of Trustees.

**Section 6.** Conditional Use. The conditional use requested in the February 11, 2016 Conditional Use Application is granted as follows:

- A. A conditional use in conjunction with Section 156.93 is hereby granted to allow the operation of a bar without live entertainment or dancing within a C-4 commercially-zoned district.

**Section 8.** Conditions. The conditional use granted herein is contingent and subject to the following conditions:

- A. The facility shall be built according to the standards and design as presented within the Applicant's petition and consistent with the Public Hearing of March 7, 2016.
- B. Building improvements must include access to the retail suite at 67 S. Broadway along the east side of the building to ensure the ability of deliveries and employees' parking to be provided without the need to access adjacent properties.
- C. Improvements including the exterior of the building shall be made according to current village codes including the Core Area Design Guidelines.

**Section 9.** Severability. In the event a court of competent jurisdiction finds this ordinance or any provision hereof to be invalid or unenforceable as applied, such finding shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance and the application thereof to the greatest extent permitted by law.

**Section 10.** Repeal and Savings Clause. **Section 11.** Effectiveness. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

**RE: PROVIDING AN ADDITIONAL CLASS A LIQUOR LICENSE**

The Village's Liquor Code can be found in Chapter 112 of the Village Code. Within this portion of the code maximum licenses are created for each type of utilization; i.e. Class A & A-1 licenses allow a bar to operate while Class C licenses are for restaurants. The total number and type of licenses changes from time to time due to a self-reducing clause that reduces the total number of licenses available when an existing license liquor owner goes out of business. Because of this feature within the village code, the Village Board must create an additional if one is to be available for a business looking to locate within Coal City and is in need of a license.

The ordinance this evening creates an additional Class A liquor license, which is likely to be utilized by Emmy's Café as long as its partnering Conditional Use is approved and the applicant proves sufficient through the requisite application and background check. Creating this license shall be the 5<sup>th</sup> one within Coal City (although the existing 4 are all A-1; the difference is the ability of existing A-1 licensed locations to provide a limited amount of take home sales). Emmy's is in need of a Class A license due to the limited food sales not expected to exceed 70% of the total receipts to occur at this location. Additionally, Emmy's must have a liquor license in order to receive gaming within the State of Illinois. This location will replace a location that formerly possessed machines and one of the Village's liquor licenses.

A portion of the presentation before the ZBA provided information that the southern half of the building at 67 S. Broadway to be split into a separate suite is expected to sell food, but shall not be in need of an additional license.

**AN ORDINANCE INCREASING THE NUMBER OF CLASS “A” LIQUOR LICENSES  
FROM ZERO TO ONE**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Coal City, Grundy and Will Counties, Illinois (the “Village”) is an Illinois non-home rule municipal corporation, organized and operating pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of Illinois; and

**WHEREAS**, Article IV of the Illinois Liquor Control Act of 1934, 235 ILCS 5/4-1, *et seq.*, authorizes the corporate authorities of the Village to license and regulate the sale of alcoholic liquor within the Village, and to determine the number, kind and classification of local liquor licenses, as well as the fees for such licenses and to provide such further regulations and restrictions on the issuance and operations pursuant to such local licenses; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village regulates the sale of liquor by creating various classifications of liquor licenses and establishing the maximum number of licenses that may be issued in each such class; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Village has received a new application for zoning relief for the issuance of a conditional use permit to allow the operation of a bar within the C-4 zoning district, which application is now pending and awaiting final action by the Village Board;

**WHEREAS**, in the event said zoning relief is granted, the applicant will apply for the issuance of a Class A Liquor License; and

**WHEREAS**, liquor licenses may be issued by the Liquor Commissioner only if the Village Board has created a sufficient number of licenses in a particular classification;

**WHEREAS**, liquor the Corporate Authorities of the Village hereby find and determine that it is in the best interest of the Village and the public to amend the Village Code to provide for one (1)

additional Class “A” Liquor License; and

**WHEREAS**, subject to the approval by the Liquor Commissioner of a forthcoming application for a Class A Liquor License and a determination that said applicant qualifies and is eligible to possess a Class A liquor license in the Village of Coal City, the Liquor Commissioner should have authority to issue an additional Class A liquor license, bringing the authorized number of such liquor licenses to one (1);

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Coal City, Counties of Will and Grundy, Illinois, as follows:

**SECTION 1. RECITALS.** The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated into and made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth in this Section 1.

**SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 112-12(A) of the Village Code (“Number of Licenses; Limitations”) shall be and hereby is amended to reflect the increase of one (1) Class “A” Liquor License to a maximum of one (1), upon the issuance by the Liquor Commissioner of an additional Class “A” License to a qualified and valid applicant on or before March 30, 2016. If no Class A liquor license shall be approved by March 30, 2016, then the number of Class “A” liquor licenses shall revert to zero (0) by operation of law without further legislative action by the Village.

**SECTION 3. REPEALER.** All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**SECTION 4. RESOLUTION OF CONFLICTS.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**SECTION 5. SAVING CLAUSE.** If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance, which are hereby declared to be separable.

**SECTION 6. EFFECTIVENESS.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in the manner provided by law.

**SECTION 7. PUBLICATION.** The Village Clerk is hereby directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

**RE: UPDATED MFT/NON-MFT STREET PROJECT FOR 2016**

Joe McKenna has been working with the Street & Alley Committee on the final roads project for 2016. At this point, the 2016 project has been planned with the Coalfield & Black Diamond projects to be completed with Bond proceeds. Doing this shall allow the Village to complete additional work on patches that are of necessity for safety on Reed Road and Berta Road. Joe will explain the final design at Thursday's meeting. The set aside for the Coalfield & Black Diamond roads has been made in hopes of possibly receiving DCEO funds from an emergency allocation rather than be required to spend existing village funds for these improvements. This year, the engineering will be paid utilizing non-MFT sources so work can be done to put the bid together prior to the onset of the FY17 fiscal year.




