APPLICATION FOR THE 2022 HOUSING REHABILITATION

PROJECT MATERIALS

Throughout 2022, the Village has been updated and strategized as to its upcoming application for a new Housing Rehabilitation Program, which allows federal dollars funded to the statewide Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunities (DCEO) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to be utilized to fund the revitalization of qualified homes within the community. Although the defined areas were previously intricately designed, DCEO has amended the guidelines to allow for any single family detached unit within the community to possibly qualify (program recipients must also qualify on an annual income basis as well). The allowance for the defined areas to grow anywhere within the municipal borders allowed Coal City to gain at least 30 qualifying surveys (both by income and housing type), which will assist with DCEO's evaluation of whether the community will qualify for the CDBG funding.

The North Central Illinois Council of Governments (NCICG) staff has worked to gather the necessary materials for the available funds now that DCEO has released the 2022 notice of funding to qualify for this program. In addition to the total number of qualified responsive surveys, Coal City's application will gain additional evaluation points for participation at the public hearing announcing Coal City's intent to apply for funding. At least 10 qualified survey responders within the crowd are expected in order to gain the total available evaluation points and allow Coal City's project area to be selected.

Like the last successful program that took place in Coal City, this is the qualifying round to determine if DCEO will award the program within Coal City. After this first step, another selection round shall be made to determined which houses within the qualified area will receive assistance.

Prepared for adoption by the Board this evening within the Regular Meeting are two Resolutions. The first adopts a Housing Rehabilitation Manual that shall guide the reviewing committee's selection of the participating single family residences. The second resolution pledges \$10,000 of support known as "first in" dollars that shall be used to reinvest in the selected qualifying homes.

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE "2023-2025 LOCAL ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY AND PROCEDURES MANUAL: HOUSING REHABILITATION PLAN"

WHEREAS, should the Village of Coal City, Illinois be awarded a Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) grant by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) to assist a minimum of ten (10) low to moderate-income single-family, owner-occupied, homeowner in rehabilitating their substandard dwellings located within the confines of a previously identified target area; bordered by the village limits within the village of Coal City, Grundy County Illinois.

WHEREAS, the aforementioned state grant resources have been applied for by the Village and related scope of rehabilitation activities must be completed within 24 months of the date of the grant awards in accordance with all applicable local, state and federal regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Coal City's Housing Rehabilitation Advisory Committee has worked cooperatively with the North Central Illinois Council of Governments to prepare a "2023-2025 Housing Rehabilitation Plan" for the Village of Coal City which includes specific administrative and programmatic policies and procedures which have been reviewed by the membership of the Coal City Housing Rehabilitation Advisory Committee and are now being recommended for approval by the Coal City Village Board to establish written policies and procedures that will enable the Coal City Housing Rehabilitation Committee and other Village staff members to implement the program's provisions in a equitable, efficient and timely manner as required by the state grant, if awarded.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Coal City Village Board that the recommendations of the Coal City Housing Rehabilitation Advisory Committee are hereby accepted and confirmed and that the policies and procedures set forth in the aforementioned publication entitled, "2023-2025 Housing Rehabilitation Plan" for the Village of Coal City, Illinois are hereby approved for implementation.

WHEREAS, it is necessary that an application be made and agreements entered into with the State of Illinois.

NOW, THERFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Coal City, Grundy and Will Counties, as follows:

- that the Village of Coal City shall apply for a grant under the terms and conditions of the State of Illinois and shall enter into and agree to the understandings and assurances contained in said application.
- 2) that the Mayor and Village Clerk on behalf of the Village of Coal City shall execute such documents and all other documents necessary for the carrying out of said application.
- 3) that the Village shall accumulate \$10,000 towards the local match to be utilized for Housing Rehabilitation within the identified neighborhood; this total amount may consist of matching funds pledged by a partnering non-profit agencies such as the Community Foundation of Grundy County.
- 3) that the Village staff is authorized to provide such additional information as may be required to accomplish the obtaining of such grant.
